

Course Description

Our course explores virtue in the Medieval world of cathedrals and castles, but also fields and farms. We will investigate the Medieval people of Europe in our first semester and then expand across the globe in second semester.

Our readings come from medieval people themselves and then those throughout history who have been inspired by that world in studying, translating, and writing their own literary works. You will write too, analyzing those texts and creating original works of poetry, fiction, and prose.

This is a year-long course consisting of 9 units.
