

Course Description

This class examines world history primarily from the "western" perspective, meaning European and North American, but adds in significant global aspects. We will examine primary sources whenever possible, and we will learn how to read and interpret these sources like a historian. The primary tool that we will use to do this is an acronym – SOAPS. We cover a lot of history in this class – the beginning of human existence, up until now.

This is a year-long course consisting of 11 units. Upon successful completion students will receive 1 credit towards high school graduation.
